The spring of 1919 Modern Aluminum Castings Co., Inc. (Incorporated in 1957) began as Modern Machine & Pattern Co., a proprietorship business in Terre Haute. The company produced machine tools fixtures and pattern tooling for the foundry industry. Later, the company expanded to manufacture production quantities of castings for American industries, including - aluminum water pump housings and fuel pump housings for automobiles, magneto and distributor housings for race cars, castings for sonar radar equipment installed on U.S. Navy submarines, aluminum cookware, post base castings, tractor-trailer support castings, aluminum component parts for industrial floor cleaning machines, industrial lighting fixtures, mechanical sub-assemblies, and aluminum mainline parts-loading pallets for the automotive industry. Alumina Products Co., Division, Tarpon Springs, Florida, a wholly owned subsidiary, produces aluminum mailboxes, street signs and accessories to the home construction industry and homeowner associations in Florida.
